Hello, Residents and Businesses of St Robert,

I hope everyone is enjoying the warmer weather as we go into June and summertime. The longer days will give us plenty of time to enjoy being outside and spending time with family and friends. I hope everyone will have the opportunity to relax and have fun this summer. So enjoy yourselves!

The city had a council meeting May 23. First, we approved renewing the St. Robert Post Office lease for another ten years. The Post Office has limited hours currently serving our city. Although, I have been told some people have to travel after our post office closes to other post offices in the late afternoon. Someday, I hope the Post Office expands their hours at our post office. Another item on the council agenda was a work change order for the wastewater treatment plant. The change order was still within the grant limits of 22 million the city has and was approved. A land development committee for J. H. Williamson Covenants was appointed to address new material language for a building proposed along J. H. Williamson Drive. The building materials were approved by the land development committee at a subsequent meeting of the development committee. The city also approved purchasing a new phone system for the city. The old phone system is internet based and when the internet goes down, all city phones are transferred to one cell phone. This has caused problems for the police and fire departments as more internet outages occur. The old phone system is over ten years old and the new system should be installed over the next two months. Lastly, the council approved a grant application for an electric charging station. The grant application is for \$600,000 with a 20% match by the city. Grants are competitive and we are told we have a 50/50 chance to win this grant.

The Public Works Street Department is back hauling loads of dirt to J.H. Williamson Drive behind Subway and onto the city industrial site on Superior Road. The dirt hauling is a project that will last several years. Last year they hauled almost thirty thousand cubic yards of dirt. Hopefully, this will lead to developable land for industrial businesses needing flat land to build factory type businesses which would increase employment opportunities hiring in the city. The Water, Sewer, and Electric Departments have remained busy with finishing up the RV Park and providing maintenance of city equipment across the city.

The St Robert Park Department has been very busy getting the parks maintained and the huge job of getting the pool ready for opening. We have a new parks supervisor this year, although he has been with the city over nineteen years in public works. He was already certified for all aspects of the pool and parks department. He has done the repairs and monitored the pool since its opening. He has started off with great reviews and has been very busy getting everything done. The WSR Sports programs is also going well with signups and games running smoothly. Thanks to all for the hard work.

The Transfer Station continues to amaze me. The residential routes, dumpsters, and the loading of trailers to haul trash to Hartville landfill. It is a huge job and the crews handle over 200 tons per day, basically handling the trash twice before it leaves for Hartville. They do it daily with some overtime to accomplish routes or loading of trailers for Hartville. They are suppose to receive a new residential trash truck during June. The truck was ordered a year ago and the crews are looking forward to having the new truck on hand.

The city of St Robert still has hiring opportunities. They are in Public Works for labors and CDL Drivers and water department. They are listed on indeed.com for St Robert. ELECTRONIC PAYMENTS FOR UTILITIES

The Utility Department would like to offer the opportunity for our customers to take advantage of electronic bill payment options. There are three options available:

1. Call our toll free number (877) 690-3729. All you will need is your utility account and the jurisdiction #3500.
2. Come into the Utility Office and sign up for auto draft of your checking or savings account. This option occurs before penalties are accessed.
3. Visit our web site at www.saintrobert.com. This option offers quick pay and a view and pay your account option.

BUDGET BILLING

The Utility Billing department has budget program for qualifying accounts. The utility department will process a one year average of your utility account, and this amount will be the required monthly payment. Our budget program year begins in July and ends in June of the following year. At the end of the budget year customers will need to zero out their account. If the customer has a credit balance a check will be issued. If there is a balance owed on the account, this balance will need to be paid before the start of the new budget year.
